JANUARY REPORT 2020

I have been looking back over the past twelve months of Community Outreach events and workshops. As we had started after Easter in 2018, 2019 was the first full year. During 2019 there was a total of 150 events and workshops. There were 60 events and workshops aimed at adults including the regular Cathedral Crafts group and Artwalks. There were 52 school events including workshops and collective worship plus another 4 workshops for pre-school children. There were 34 events and workshops for Christian nurture of young people. This included Family Fun, Messy Cathedral and Youth Film sessions. I was supported by volunteers at 68 of these events. In total 5,030 people attended a workshop or event.

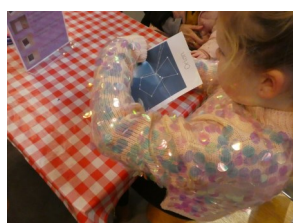
Christian Nurture for Young People

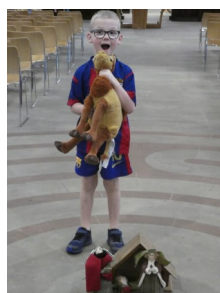

Artwalk

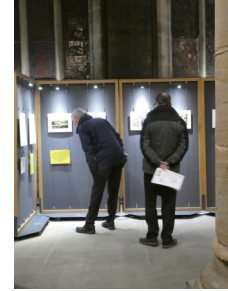
